## Prayers etc.

Vincent de Paul CM was a French Roman Catholic priest who dedicated himself to serving the poor. He is venerated as a saint in the Catholic Church and the Anglican Communion. He was canonized in 1737. He was renowned for his compassion, humility and generosity. The Society of St Vincent de Paul (SVP) is an international voluntary organization in the Catholic Church, founded in 1833. Members of the SVP work together to offer material help to the poor or needy .

**Our Lady of Walsingham** –the lady if the manor of Walsingham in Norfolk was instructed by a vision of the Virgin Mary to build on her village an exact replica of the house in Nazareth in which the Annunciation had taken place. The vision occurred, according to tradition in 1061, though a more likely date for the construction of the shrine is 100 years later. The original house was destroyed in the reformation, but during the 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries pilgrimage to Walsingham was revived for Anglicans and Catholics.
