Prayers etc.

St. Teresa of Calcutta – She was born Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu in Skopje, Macedonia in 1910. She joined the Sisters of Loreto in Dublin, where she was given the name of Sister Mary Teresa. The following year she travelled to Calcutta, India, and taught in various schools there for the next 20 years. During that time, she was deeply moved by the numbers of sick and dying people on the streets, and felt called to be God's love in action to serve the sick and dying, the hungry and homeless. She received permission to leave the Loreto convent and sought medical training, determined to serve the poorest of the poor. Eventually she was joined by other women, some of whom were her former students. In 1950 she established an order of religious women called the Missionaries of Charity. Over time, the Missionaries of Charity have built centres throughout the world. In 1979 Mother Teresa as she was by then known, received the Nobel Peace Prize. She captivated the world by as few other people have. Her simple message was "we are put on earth to do something beautiful for God". Pope John Paul II advanced the cause of Mother Teresa soon after her death on September 5th 1997 saying he was waiving the normal five-year waiting period because of widespread public admiration for her. She was beatified by Pope John Paul in 2003 and Pope Francis declared her a saint on 4th September 2016.

The Translation of St Cuthbert. – Cuthbert—"the child of God" (St Bede), was buried on Lindisfarne. When the Vikings began to raid the north-east coast of England, the saint's remains were removed and the monks carried his coffin all over Northumbria. Many churches were built on the sites where the coffin rested (for example at Cotherstone, near Barnard Castle. Eventually the saint's body was laid to rest in the great shrine at Durham where it remained until the Shrine's destruction at the time of the Reformation

St Gregory the Great, Pope and Doctor of the Church. 540– 604)) belonged to a Roman patrician family and served as a magistrate before embracing the monastic life. He was papal legate at Constantinople and elected Pope in 590. He tightened Church discipline, liturgical practice, reorganised the lands belonging to the Holy See and sent St. Augustine to convert the Kingdom of Kent. He is consequently called the "Apostle of the English" His theological and pastoral writings, made him a Doctor of the Church.
